

## Action Set 13

This set will assist you in **REVIEWING** what you learned from “Islam & Education”. This set merely reviews this material, but you must realize that **APPLYING** it goes out to your daily life from here – to the years ahead of you that will be home to your growth as a Muslim, a citizen, and a learned human being, inshAllah.

With regards to the final exam, no test can adequately consolidate all that you’ve encountered. But by learning through action, you’ve ascertained the big picture that these pixels of ideas make up. You have seen how Islam champions these bonds of solidarity and ties well the concepts of worldly and spiritual success, not through speeches and dinners, but through habitual action – through hard work. To truly grow as a Muslim, your life needs to extend beyond blind worship into that **pursuit of knowledge**. By gaining an appreciation of that value using the college admissions process, we pray that you will continue to use these methods and outlook as you pursue learning about Islam.

- Think... Think very hard about the big picture ideas. Think about the themes through the process. Think about what you have personally gained and what you plan to do with it.
- Review the lecture slides, particularly the final presentation on Islam & Education, which will encompass the majority of the test.
- With your newfound friendships at mentorship (and email addresses), create a study guide discussing the key points of what you learned.
  - Not trivial things like “how many sentences we should have for each extracurricular”, but big themes like “depth is at times be more poignant than breadth as seen by the level of detailed needed for discussion at interviews, in essays, and even by a 10-activity limit on the Common App”.

Note: the final exam will be entirely free-response and short essay.
